Service in Cambodia

Since the 1970s Cambodia has been a troubled nation. Civil war followed by the Khmer Rouge regime tore Cambodia apart, resulting in the deaths of millions. Unfortunately the effects of war still impact the community today because Cambodia remains one of the poorest countries in the world. Even necessities that you and I take for granted such as safe drinking water are scarce.

As a part of Trinity's expanded focus on service, the College will be offering students the opportunity to take part in the Cambodia 2013 mission trip. The purpose of the mission trip is to enable students to experience the culture and history of Cambodia and offer compassionate and practical support within a Christian understanding of caring for the poor.

The trip will be offered to students currently in years 9, 10 and 11 and is planned to take place in January 2013, prior to the school year commencing. This two week mission trip will cost about \$4,500 with opportunities for fundraising being held in throughout this year.

Students who would like to attend the Cambodia 2013 mission trip are required to complete an 'Expression of Interest' application form and return it to their school's front office by Friday 23rd March (end of week 8).
